DENTAL GRADUATE ATTRIBUTES

According to the Holland code framework, which categorizes career interests into six different types, attributes of a dentist can be described within three hemispheres: building, thinking, and helping areas. Building Hemisphere: In the building interest area, a dentist's skills lie in working with instruments and machinery. This involves a high level of dexterity and manual skill to perform precise procedures effectively. A sense of artistic talent can be beneficial for dentists as it aids in crafting or repairing practical items, such as dental prosthetics or restorations. Dentists must possess the ability to manipulate tools delicately within the limited space of the oral cavity to ensure accurate and successful treatment outcomes.

Thinking Hemisphere: The thinking area emphasizes research, investigation, and understanding natural laws, which are essential components of dental practice. Dentists must engage in accurate observation and adopt a thorough and methodical approach to each case they encounter. This involves analyzing patient symptoms, interpreting diagnostic tests, and formulating treatment plans based on scientific principles and evidence-based practice. A dentist's ability to think critically and solve complex problems is crucial for diagnosing dental conditions and providing appropriate care to patients.

Helping Hemisphere: In the helping interest area, a dentist's focus lies in demonstrating compassion, empathy, and service-oriented mentality towards patients. Dentists interact closely with patients, addressing their concerns, alleviating fears, and providing emotional support throughout the treatment process. Additionally, dentists may engage in community programs and public awareness campaigns to promote oral health and preventive care. Effective communication skills are essential for building
